We lost our freedom but we got a very good opportunity so given the opportunity we can shine our own courage, determination, resilience and wisdom, ” said His Holiness the Dalai Lama. On the profound teaching including logic and philosophy, His Holiness mentioned that profound teachings can be explained in Tibetan as the Sanskrit language is known only to a few scholars and thus His Holiness expressed the importance of Tibetan language. His Holiness also expressed the need to preserve and promote Buddhist tradition and mentioned that those who know Buddhist tradition knows that this tradition is not something which is followed on blind faith but through reason and logic.

“The worst case was Tibetan people and cultural tradition were at the verge of destruction and extinction and we were born at such time. We have a very unique and profound tradition which we were able to keep alive and this is our contribution. So Tibet as you all know is called the land taken care of by Avalokiteshvara.” His Holiness said to the former officials present at the ceremony. His Holiness assured the former officials who have worked for the Tibetan administration for more than decades that they will be guided and taken care of by the Avalokiteshvara afterlife as they share a special connection with the Avalokiteshvara. ### India, its people done a lot: Tibetans

*IANS, July 16, Dharamshala:* For Tibetans in exile, the Indian government and people of India have done a lot for Tibet. Even Tibetan spiritual leader the Dalai Lama calls himself a "son of India". However, they say if the people in Tibet were to get more autonomy within the Chinese constitution it could be achieved only through the political support of India and its people. "China has occupied Tibet and we expect India has the only legitimacy and credibility to speak about Tibet," a senior Central Tibetan Administration (CTA) functionary told IANS on Tuesday. "It is due to India's consistent generosity and kindness, we, the people in exile, have been able to preserve

our ancient cultural heritage in exile," he added. Amidst the tensions with China last year, the Indian government was reported to have cautioned its senior officials to stay away from events aimed at marking the start of the Dalai Lama's 60th year of exile. After canceling events in the national capital, the Tibetan government-in-exile started pan-India "Year of Gratitude" programmes here. The Dalai Lama escaped from Tibet to India in March 1959. After the cancellation of events in the national capital, the Dalai Lama, in an interview to CNN News18, had said he "doesn't care about how Chinese pressure forced the cancellation of the events of the Tibetan government-in-exile in Delhi". He said it was more about "how you feel for Tibetans and how Tibetans feel for India". Expressing gratitude to his followers, the Dalai Lama in a statement on July 10 said: "I am whole-heartedly committed to reviving an appreciation of ancient Indian knowledge among young Indians today." On his return to his homeland, an optimist Dalai Lama says, "Yes". "I remain optimistic that I will be able to return to Tibet. China is in the process of changing," a post on his website quoting the Dalai Lama said. "If you compare China today to 10 or 20 years ago, there is a tremendous change. China is no longer isolated. It is part of the world community. Global interdependence, especially in terms of economics and environment making it impossible for nations to remain isolated. "Besides, I am not seeking separation from China. I am committed to my middle-way approach whereby Tibet remains within the People's Republic of China enjoying a high degree of self-rule or autonomy," he added. Though living in exile in India for over half a century, the longing to see their homeland has not waned among the Tibetan residents in this north Indian hill town. "I am keen to set foot on the soil that I left decades ago," said Tenzin Namgyal, an octogenarian living here since the 1960s. Central Tibetan Administration President Lobsang Sangay on Friday greeted Prime Minister Narendra Modi on his victory in the Lok Sabha elections. But Tibetan activist and poet Tenzin Tsundue, who is

born and brought up in India, believes that India has never been in a superior position to counter China on Tibet. “What India has been able to do was protect its interests quietly until Doklam, that’s when India stood the ground firmly,” he said. Sixty years ago, some 80,000 Tibetans, along with their spiritual leader the Dalai Lama, left Lhasa after a failed uprising against the Communist rule over Tibet and fled to India. The Tibetan exile administration, called the CTA, is based in this northern Indian hill town, where the spiritual leader also lives.

**CTA President condoles demise of former Delhi Chief Minister Sheila Dikshit**

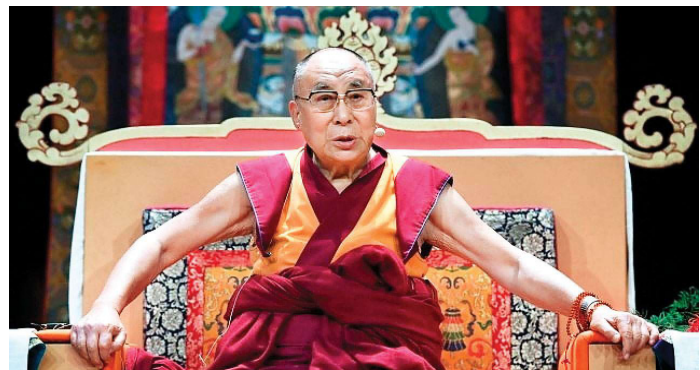

*Tibet.net, July 20, Dharamshala:* President Dr Lobsang Sangay condoled the demise of veteran Indian leader and former Delhi Chief Minister Sheila Dikshit who passed away at the age of 81 after suffering a cardiac arrest on Saturday. Extending his heartfelt condolences to family and loved ones of Smt Sheila Dikshit, Dr Sangay said he was deeply saddened to hear that the veteran Indian leader and dear friend of Tibet is no more. “A stalwart Congress leader, Former Union Minister, Member of Parliament and longest serving Chief Minister of Delhi, Smt. Sheila Dikshit devoted her entire life to the service of the nation and society. Throughout her 15-year stint as the Chief Minister of Delhi, she made immense contribution to the state and her governance ushered all-round development of the national capital,” the President said. Furthermore, he said, “She was a staunch supporter and long time friend of Tibet and Tibetan people who had deep reverence for His Holiness the Dalai Lama.

She played a vital role in ensuring the welfare of Tibetans living in India especially Tibetan residents of Delhi.” “Tibet and Tibetan cause has always remained dear to her heart for she always stood and supported for the cause of Tibet and Tibetan people.” He concluded, “Tibetans worldwide will forever remember her as a torch bearer of Tibetan movement in India and a true friend. Our thoughts are with the bereaved family and supporters.” Smt Sheila Dikshit was the president of the Delhi Congress. The veteran politician was the longest-serving chief minister of the Indian capital, serving for three terms from 1998 to 2013. She also served as the governor of the southern state of Kerala. Dikshit became an MP for the first time from Kannauj Lok Sabha seat in Uttar Pradesh in 1984. She was also a close associate of former Prime Minister Rajiv Gandhi and a minister in his cabinet. She breathed her last on Saturday in a cardiac arrest.

**India has to stand up to China on Dalai Lama’s succession**

*DNA, July 23, New Delhi:* India, in its attempt to strike a rapport with China, should not renege on her time-honoured stand on Dalai Lama. Earlier, the NDA government had issued a note to senior officials, asking them not to attend events organised by the Tibetan government-in-exile. India has also supported the ‘One China’ policy, which states that Taiwan and Tibet are part of China’s mainland. Beijing made the ‘One-China’ policy a prerequisite for countries to establish diplomatic ties with it. Chinese authorities have warned that Dalai Lama’s successor has to be decided within China and any ‘interference’ by India will impact bilateral ties. The Tibetan spiritual leader has taken China to task for raking up the issue of his successor, asserting that the

subject would be decided by the people of Tibet. By tagging its sensitivities on Dalai Lama as a perquisite for settlement of the border dispute with India, China runs the risk of overusing its Tibet card, which India must not lose sight of. Though Nehru's unwillingness to condemn China's invasion of Tibet and the expulsion of Dalai Lama in the 1950s was a mistake, his decision to give refuge to the spiritual guru and the ruler of Tibetan Buddhists, in India on March 1959, cannot be faulted. The Uighurs have been condemned to a fate similar to the Tibetans, fighting Chinese domination for centuries, enjoying brief periods of independence twice during the twentieth century, facing threats from Han Chinese migration alongside rigours of "centrally" planned development policies besides being subject to newly-strengthened anti-terror measures. All of this cannot be and is not Western propaganda. Nehru signed the agreement in 1954, knowing fully well that Tibetans would be disappointed. In 1959, following a crackdown on an uprising by the local population in Tibet, the 14th Dalai Lama, Tenzin Gyatso, fled to India. Therefore, 2019 is the 60th year of the great event incidentally when the Modi government's policy of standing up to China is touted to be a sharp departure from Nehru's China policy. India, overly careful in assuaging Chinese sensitivities, must not concede further. If the fear to offend Beijing becomes an obsession, or India is seen to be too much in awe of China as has been the case for decades, it might be unfairly treated at international fora like the Organisation for Islamic Countries (OIC) that remains critical of India but is wary of offending China. With the succession issue of the Dalai Lama assuming importance, India would have to take a firm decision. The US Congress has made it clear that it would not recognise a Dalai Lama chosen by the Chinese government, nor does the current Dalai Lama believe anyone to trust the Chinese government's choice. The point is this: has India, which has seen Tibet as part of China for over five decades, made more concessions than it has received? No Indian government has ever sought to extend political support to the Dalai Lama, despite the

tortuous contours of Sino-Indian relationship. If China links Tibet and Dalai Lama to a settlement of the long-standing border dispute, it amounts to distrust of India's position. The succession of Dalai Lama is distinctly different from China's claims to Tibet. If India lends support to a future Dalai Lama chosen by China, it would not only fritter away its time-honored policy on Tibet, but the mistake of 1954 would also turn a full circle.
